We are an online, interdisciplinary, and graduate student-run open-access journal dedicated, but not limited, to the disciplines of folklore and ethnomusicology.

We are currently interested in the following:

- 1) **Articles**: 5,000–10,000 words + abstract (125-word minimum)
- 2) **Open Forum**: 3,000 word maximum
  - Thought pieces about contemporary concerns, current events, field experiences, responses to articles
- 3) Biographical Features
  - Transcribed interviews, biographies about a specific folklorist or ethnomusicologist (autoethnographies included)
- 4) Collectanea
  - Narratives, music, recordings, or other field collections with introductory commentary
- 5) **Reviews**: 2,000 words maximum
  - Please consult our website for available books to review
  - Exhibitions, CDs, performances, festivals, films, etc. also eligible to review
- 6) Bibliographies
  - For special topics, 10+ sources with foreword
  - For general topics, 30+ sources with foreword
- 7) Translations
  - Please contact us if you are interested in translating a text into English
- 8) Short films: 30 min. maximum
  - Must be in cross platform compatible formats such as .mp4, .avi, .flv, and .wmv
- 9) **Podcasts** 
  - Must be in mono channel and .wav format of 128kbps bitrates or more, with the script of the podcast included.
- 10) Photography and digital art
  - Must be in JPEG format, 600 dpi, 1280x720 or more, with a short write-up of 125 words or less explaining the submission.



Textual submissions must adhere to the following format standards:

- Times New Roman, 12 pt. font
- Double spaced, 1-inch margins
- Citations in Chicago Manual of Style format (17<sup>th</sup> ed., author-date)
- Email subject line: "Folklore Forum Submission: Your Name"
